






PRIYANSHI MISHRA (Batch 2019-20)

MESSENGERS OF HOPE

It was three in the morning, an hour yet to go before refilling of oxygen would begin in some parts of Delhi & Gurugram. It was also the time when at other places, oxygen refilling had just been finished. It was also the hour when hopeful families were scrambling all over India to seek hospital beds for their loved ones since with dawn comes a new list of empty beds, the ones left by those that perhaps found a place in the heaven above us. It was also the hour when an empathetic brother, a headstrong sister, a proud father, a resourceful mother and a true friend tried to get their eyes shut for a bit with hopes in their hearts that their prayers would be answered by God. At the same hour, a few thousand strangers unbeknownst to each other, connected by sympathy, humanity and a good internet connection were carrying on with their tedious task of finding hope in the bleakest corner of their lives and updating an excel sheet. Thousands of such excel sheets proved to be the bridge between life and death when all day long, volunteers (both young and old, both women and men, both poor and rich and both illiterates and literates) used it to call multiple vendors engaged in oxygen refilling to the ones providing life saving drugs to the ones operating an ambulance to the ones providing essential supplies.

What everybody lived through in the second wave of COVID-19 can be described only by the saints and sages. It's trauma can only be captured by the poets who are able to catch rain and fire in their words, it's effect on humanity manifested itself when enemies became friends, when bonds of friendship became stronger than ever and when we realized that what and who we are is as simple as what and who we call our family. We belong with our families, we are our families and that we all our part of this one big family - humanity.

Families are of all kinds, we can choose to distance ourselves but sooner or later it catches up with us. We are defined by where we come from and where we come from is exemplified by our actions, inactions, thoughts and expression. One such family that we somehow leave behind is the ones we grew up with, whose lunches we all stole to tease but always ate together, whose smiles and cries made the first and most lasting of impressions on our heart, mind and soul. The ones we saw everyday from the time we were quite young to the ones we said goodbye with teary eyes and long hugs when we were a bit older. The family that met in one uniform each day to stand together, praying to the Lord to bless us, the family we played and pranked with. The family for which we yearn forever once we move on, our mother-like teachers and our fellow friends and us all being called the most notorious of students.

One such noble initiative undertaken by our BBPS Dwarka Family was to create a "Covid-19 HELP" group on whatsapp and other social media platforms, where we all connected in real time to seek and provide all the information available with any of us in real time. 24 hours a day, students both former and present ones resolved and acted upon with only one objective: to make sure that whosoever reaches out for help gets authentic aid at the earliest possible. Students selflessly devoted many crucial weeks seeking oxygen, beds, medicines, ambulances and providing a space for the vulnerable and most affected ones to speak of their plight in a safe space and without any hesitancy; even while they themselves could've been in trauma for the calamity was unprecedented indeed.


