"Lead me to truth from ignorance, lead me to light from the darkness, lead me to immortality from death. Let there be peace."



Children to be encouraged to take a walk around a neighbourhood park or a colony garden and look for the signs of the Spring Season. The Sun, the flowers, the bees, the butterflies, green trees with new leaves, and practice yoga in natural environment like garden to welcome the Spring Season.

SUN SALUTE OR EXTENDED MOUNTAIN POSE

Stand tall in Mountain Pose, look up, reach your arms up to the sky, and place your palms together.





TREE POSE

Stand on one leg, fold your opposite knee, place the sole of your foot on your inner thigh, and balance. Sway like a tree in the breeze.

FLOWER POSE

Sit on the ground with a tall spine, lift your legs, balance on your sitting bones, touch the soles of your feet together, and weave your arms under your legs. Pretend to blossom like a flower.





BUTTERFLY POSE

Sit on the ground with a tall spine, bend your legs, place the soles of your feet together, and gently flap your legs like the wings of a butterfly.

MAHASHIVRATRI

Mahashivratri or "The Great Night of Shiva" is a widely celebrated festival

of Lord Shiva. It falls in the months of February or March each year. This year Mahashivratri is on Tuesday 1st March 2022.

Why do we celebrate Mahashivratri?

Dear Facilitators

Indian mythology contains a vast and ancient array of tales, which are stimulating, entertaining, and have a moral lesson behind them. There are stories related to Mahashivratri which would fascinate our little ones and help them understand the relevance of celebrating the festival.

The story is..... The Gods and the Demons had decided to churn the ocean to get a sweet drink called Amrita. Whoever drank this liquid would never die and be blessed till eternity. This was known as the Samudra Manthan. However, while churning the ocean, many other things also emerged from the sea. Among them was Halahala or the Pot of Poison. Now, the Gods and the Demons both got extremely terrified. They knew the poison was so toxic that it could wipe out everything in the entire universe. So, on the advice of Lord Vishnu, the Gods ran to Lord Shiva for pleading for help and protection.

Lord Shiva drank the poison himself to protect all living beings. However, Parvati, his wife, did not want the poison to enter his body. She wanted him to spit it out. So, she immediately tied a snake around his neck. This prevented the poison from reaching his stomach.

However, the Gods did not want Lord Shiva to spit out the poison. So, they began to sing songs and dance in his praise. They kept doing that all night long and with bated breath kept wondering how Lord Shiva would save the world without annoying his wife. Finally at dawn, pleased with their love and devotion, Lord Shiva locked the poison in his throat for eternity. The poison was so powerful that it changed the colour of Lord Shiva's neck to blue. This is the reason why he is also known as "Neelkanth" (the blue-necked one) where "neela" means blue and "kanth" means neck.

Mahashivratri is a celebration of how Lord Shiva saved the world with his generosity. Since then, on this day devotees fast, keep vigil, sing songs praising Lord Shiva, and meditate all night long.

Damru craft for Maha Shivratri

LEARNING OUTCOMES

The child will be able to-

- Develop eye-hand coordination and fine motor skills.
- Associate the musical instrument with the significance of the festival.

Material Required:

- Two paper cups of the same size
- White ivory sheet
- Brown paint and paintbrush
- Golden beads
- · Thick coloured wool/thread
- Black marker
- String of beads
- Scissors and Glue



How to Make the Paper Cup Damru:

1. Use the open ends of the paper cup as a stencil to draw two circles on the white craft paper. Cut them out and make two black circles in the middle using the marker.





- 2. Paint the paper cups brown. Let the cups dry completely. You may have to apply another coat of paint over it.
- 3. Once the cups are completely dry, stick the bottoms together with craft glue.

- 4. Now stick the two circles on either open ends of the paper cups.
- 5. Thread the coloured yarn through the golden beads and knot it at the ends. Tie the yarn around the middle of the damru, so that the joint is not visible.





6. Decorate the damru with jewel stickers or other embellishments.

Holi is the festival of colours and is celebrated in the Spring Season. It is a festive day to meet others, play and laugh, forget, forgive, and repair broken relationships. The festival also celebrates the beginning of a good spring <u>harvest</u> season.

The first evening is known as Holika Dahan (burning of Demon Holika) or Chhoti Holi and the following day as Holi, Rangwali Holi, Dol Purnima, Dhuleti, Dhulandi, Ukuli, Manjal Kuli, Yaosang, Shigmo or Phagwah, Jajiri.

Dear Facilitator

Let us make our children understand the festival by telling them a story Holi takes root from the story of Hiranyakashyap, a king who believed he was

immortal and should be worshipped as such. His son, Prahlad, was a devoted worshipper of Lord Vishnu, and it made Hiranyakashyap angry that his own son would worship Lord Vishnu over him. As the story goes, Lord Vishnu appeared in the form of a half-lion, half-man and killed Hiranyakashyap, and thus, "Good won over Evil."



Also, let us guide our children to admire the natural colours in the environment like green (the colour of growth), blue (the calming colour represents serenity & stability), red & orange colour of flowers (symbolizes energy, vitality, cheer, and excitement). Also, encourage them to play Holi with natural colours made by dry flowers, turmeric, henna etc...

WATER PICHKARI: HOLI CRAFT

Learning Outcome:

The child will be able to:

- * Associate pichkari with the festival of colours.
- Enhance creativity
- Improve eye hand coordination and fine motor skills

Material Required:

- ♣ Paper roll tube
- **4** Straw
- 4 Paint
- Scissors
- ♣ Glue
- Poster Paints
- Yellow pastel sheet

Steps:

1. Paint the paper roll tube and let it dry.

2. While the tube is drying, cut out a circle of 1.5cm in diameter from a yellow pastel sheet. Punch a hole in the middle of the circle. This is to make



3. Take a straw and trim its bent part (roughly half the length)



4. Insert the straw through the hole of the yellow circular base.




5. Glue the base on the snipped end of the tube keeping the bent end of the straw inside.

6. Decorate the tube.



7. Cut another circle (3.5cm in diameter) from yellow paper to make the cone shape on top of the pichkari.



8. Glue the cone to the top of the tube.



9. Glue a pom-pom on the straw handle. And your bright and colourful pichkari is ready for Holi.

Teaching children to respect the school's property is a great, concrete way to impart lessons for school life and moral character.



Schools are vital for everyone as it helps one to acquire skills and knowledge, prepare us for tomorrow, and to build a good career in life.


School is the second home for children as they grow here for love, care & "learning".

ENGLISH LITERACY

WORD ANTAKSHARI

Dear Facilitator,

Word Games are great because they help children focus on sounds and letters and develop skills they need for reading and writing. Antakshari is an Indian word that means the last letter of the word.

Learning Outcome:

The children will be able to:

- Enjoy the Word Antakshari game.
- Recollect many words
- Improve reading and writing skills.
- Enhance their memory and logical thinking.



The facilitator can play a Word Antakshari game during the virtual circle time.

It is also suggested that this game can be played by asking children to tell the words like:

WORD ANTAKSHARI GAME:

How to Play:

- 1. Children will be given one word to write.
- 2. The letter / sound with which that word ends, the child has to find another word starting with that letter and write it on their whiteboard.
- 3. For Example Given word: **Pond**



- 4. Children will be given 1 minute time to write as many words they can write during the given time.
- 5. Each time new word should be written with the last letter of the previous word.
- 6. Child who has written maximum words correctly will be the winner of the game. By giving another beginning word, the game can be continued in the same manner.



Language development happens very quickly in children. Once they master the world of the alphabet with their sounds, it helps cement the connection

between letters and words. Early reading with children is a true one to one opportunity for children to communicate. It also helps children to enhance their vocabulary skills. Therefore, constant reading practice helps children to retain the words in their vocabulary and also inculcates the practice to use them in their conversations.

MATHS & BLOCKS

Shape Hopscotch Game:

Learning outcome

The child will be able to:

- Move and learn while having lots of fun
- Develop their gross motor skills
- Recognize various shapes and colours
- Understand the concept of skip counting by 2s.

Steps

- Cut 6 different easily recognizable paper shapes ~ Orange stars, yellow circles, red squares, green ovals, purple squares, and blue triangles.
- Tape the coloured shapes to the floor with tape.
- Students will jump, wiggle, twirl and hop through the shapes. This game can be played individually or with peers.

Ways of playing Shape Maze

- Facilitators may call out colours or shapes and students will search the

Addition

Addition for kids is a practical process. The addition of two certain numbers is called its sum. When we add a number to the other number it is called the sum of the two numbers.

Examples


Look at the picture of balloons, there are balloons of different colours, we need to add all the balloons and find their sum.



Solution:

Number of red balloons: 2 Number of yellow balloons: 2 Number of green balloons: 1

The total number of balloons are 2+2+1=5

Subtraction

Dear Facilitator,

Learning outcome:

- use number lines and reverse counting to solve subtraction problems.

Introduce the children to the vocabulary/signs like minus, difference, takeaway, equals etc. and the real-world problem statements where subtraction applies. The easiest way for a child to imagine subtraction is as something taken away or a loss or decrease of quantity.


Consider these examples:

Example 1: Maitri has 5 apples. She gives 2 of them to her friend Radha. How many apples are still with Maitri?

Example 2: There are 4 members in John's family. Two of them went out. How many are at home?

Example 3: Mary had 10 rupees in her pocket. She purchased an ice-cream for 5 rupees. How much money is she left with?

Example 4: Give 4 cookies to your child. Now ask him to share 2 of them with you or a sibling. Let him count the remaining cookies.

Calligraphy is the art of beautiful handwriting. It allows us to see each word and phrase and helps to stimulates neuronal activity. So, learning calligraphy and handwriting helps to develop fine motor skills and increase memory retention.

Creative Writing also includes children to explore and use their imagination to make a story. For example, let's say that with imagination the child can recreate a funny experience that has actually happened, or maybe make up an exciting story about his/her anecdote.
