Dear facilitators, the early childhood experiences should progress from simple to complex, from known to unknown and from concrete to abstract. In reference to this, the following activities have been divided on weekly basis.

Week II (8th -14th February): Spring season, Basant Mela, parts of plants, व्यंजन क, Odd one out, Writing readiness activity, Writing of numbers, Colouring in enclosed figure, Spring yoga, Vocabulary bag.

Week III (15th -21st February): Uses of plants, Speaking activity-flowers, Sight words, व्यंजन त, Find out the difference, शब्दावली, Riddles, Writing of numbers, Seriation Activity.

Week IV (22nd -28th February): Taking care of plants, Vocabulary Bag , स्वरों की पुनरावृति, Writing of numbers, Letter Game, Experiential learning.

FESTVAL OF THE MONTH

LEARNING OUTCOMES: The child will be able to-

- 1. understand importance of the festival Basant Panchami.
- 2. get motivated to celebrate the festival with family.

BASANT PANCHAMI



Basant Panchami is one of the most popular spring festivals of India. It is celebrated as the birthday of Goddess Saraswati, who symbolises knowledge, wisdom, purity and truth. Worshipping Goddess Saraswati on this day is considered very auspicious and pure.

The festival of Basant Panchami is associated with yellow colour, a colour of spirituality. This colour holds a special meaning for this celebration, as it signifies bright yellow sunshine of life. As a part of the celebrations, people wear yellow-coloured clothes, cook kesar halwa or sweet rice with saffron and offer yellow flowers to the Goddess.

During this season, the fields are brightened with yellow colour of mustard crop, which adds to the spirit of the festival

The children may wear yellow clothes to symbolize the significance of the colour. They may also be involved in the preparations for the puja of Goddess Saraswati and chant saraswati vandana together.

A VIRTUAL TOUR TO THE BASANT FAIR

During this time of pandemic when children are unable to step out of their houses, virtual tour to a Basant fair will be a great experience towards observation. When he/she starts observing his/her surroundings, the learning automatically begins. By taking children through the virtual tours to different places, the facilitators may enhance their learning as they learn while they observe. To help the children learn about a fair, a virtual visit to fair is planned. The facilitators may show the video 'A Virtual Visit to the fair' to the children during their virtual circle time sessions.

LEARNING OUTCOMES: The child will be able to:

- enjoy the virtual tour of Basant fair.
- learn about various things we get and see in Basant fair.
- enhance observation skills.
- learn to express by answering related questions.

ACTIVITY: FUN WITH BUBBLE WRAP

LEARNING OUTCOMES: The child will be able to-

- 1. develop creative expression.
- 2. enhance fine motor skills
- 3. improve eye hand coordination

<u>MATERIAL REQUIRED:</u>

- 1. Plain white sheet
- 2. 5-6 bubble wrap (Circle Shape of any size)
- 3. Yellow acrylic paint/Poster colour
- 4. Crayons
- 5. Colour pallet

STEPS:

- 1. Take yellow poster/acrylic colour in the colour pallet.
- 2. Dip your bubble wrap circle in yellow colour.
- 3. Take the impression of the bubble wrap on a white sheet to create a flower.
- 4. Children can draw leaves and stem with the help of crayons

SOCIAL VALUE/SKILL GREEN HABITS



NEP 2020 aims at providing a strong foundation for cognitive and discovery-based learning. In their formative years, children learn to use their critical thinking and creativity to establish connections between their previous knowledge, ideas and construct new knowledge.

LEARNING OUTCOMES: The child will be able to-

- 1. understand about clean environment.
- 2. understand about green environment.
- learn about the community living.
- 4. be friendly towards environment.

"Green" is more than just a colour. It also means taking special steps to protect the environment — the water, the land, and the air we breathe. Why green? Plants are green, and without them the Earth wouldn't be such a lovely home for us. It is never too early to start cultivating good habits and practices in children, especially since they are equally important stewards of the planet. Teaching children how to take care of it now will eventually lead to a cleaner, greener planet. By gently teaching them to:



- 1. Reduce the amount of waste you produce.
- 2. Reuse items as much as you can before throwing them.
- 3. Recycle items wherever possible.

Let us empower our children with the motto "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle". These three 'R' words are an important part of sustainable living, as they help to cut down on the amount of waste we throw away. The facilitator may encourage the children to develop some easy green habits.

RECYCLING SYMBOL



This symbol indicates that a product has been made from recycled or recyclable material and is capable of being recycled. The three arrows represent 'reducing', 'reusing', and 'recycling'. This symbol indicates that a product has been made from recycled or recyclable material and is capable of being recycled. We must use things which have the recycling symbol on them to save mother earth.

The facilitator may encourage the children to develop some easy green habits by sharing a conversation between Bharat and Bharati.

Bharat: Bharati, let's go and play in the garden.

Bharati: Okay, but let me first check all the fans, lights and other electrical appliances. Everything should be switched off when not in use.

Bharat: Oh yes! I will also help you. It's done now. Now let's go.

Both of them reach the garden.

Bharati: Oh look, the water is continuously flowing out of the pipe. I must quickly close the tap to avoid water wastage.

Bharat: Good Bharati. But please be careful, don't bring your bicycle inside the garden. You will crush all the plants here. Please park it outside only.

Bharati: Yes Bharat, we must always be aware of our actions and help our earth by developing green habits.


Bharat: Bharati... there are many more green habits that one should follow. They are:

- Turning off the lights while leaving a room.

3. Reusing glass and metal jars to store pantry items and old clothes to make beautiful braided rugs.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Sunflower oil can be used for cooking, skin care and is even used to produce some medicines.

DID YOU KNOW?

Looking pretty in a vase wasn't the only way to use roses in the kitchen. Their petals are edible and rose water (made from soaking the petals in water) is often added to jellies or jams or is used as flavouring in dishes.

Children need daily opportunities to communicate, express and talk freely about their experiences, likes and dislikes. Talking is important for the child's language development and general knowledge.

Let's understand and learn few interesting facts about why spring is great.

1. AIR IS VERY PLEASENT

Spring marks the end of blistering winter and the weather becomes pleasant. During spring people feel fresh air.

We all can spend more time outside without feeling cold, which leads to great physical and mental health.

The facilitator may tell children that plants can be of different shapes and sizes with the help of various pictures of plants.






TYPES OF PLANTS Creepers are plants that grow along the ground like watermelon, pumpkin etc.

VOCABULARY BAG


LEARNING OUTCOMES: The child will be able to-

LEARNING OUTCOMES: The child will be able to-

- name different fruits and vegetables.
- tell the benefits of eating them.

The facilitator will encourage the children to keep with them any one of their favourite fruit and vegetable during virtual circle time. Children will be encouraged to name them. Benefits of eating them will also be discussed with the children.



For e.g.:

- Apples are tasty and make us healthy.
- Bananas keep our stomach clean.
- Carrots are good for our eyes.
- Spinach keeps us strong.






Trees provide shelter, food and protection to many animals. Let us not cut trees and make the animals homeless!

PARENTING A PLANT

LEARNING OUTCOMES: The child will be able to-

- name various things a plant needs to grow.
- understand that plants also need proper love and care.



One day Bharat was sitting sadly during his Virtual Circle Time.

<u>Facilitator:</u> - Hey! What's the matter, why are you looking sad?

Bharat: - Ma'am, I brought this rose plant four days back and kept it on my study table but it is not growing.

Facilitator: - Oh! That's the matter.

Bharat: Ma'am how would it grow big?

Facilitator: Bharat, As love and care from your family members helped you to grow big. In the same way plants also need food and care. When plants get air, water and sunlight, they also grow big.

Bharat: -Ma'am, how can we take care of the plants?

<u>Facilitator</u>: - We should keep them in sunlight and give them water from time to time. We must remember that plants are also living things like us. It's just that they can't move and play like us. So, we should always take good care of them.

Bharat: - Yes ma'am, I will surely take care of the plants.



ACTIVITY


Let us observe, what would happen if plants do not get enough sunlight, water and air.

Take two plants of the same size. Water them daily.

- Keep one plant in the fresh air and where it gets enough sunlight.
- Keep the other plant in a closed box or container.
- After four to five days, observe them closely to find out the change in the leaves of both the plants.

The facilitator will recapitulate with the help of following questions during circle time.

- 1. Was the plant in the box looking happy?
- 2. Which of the two plants had green leaves?
- 3. The plant kept at the window looks fresh. Right? Why?
- 4. What does a plant need to become big and strong?

STAMPING GAME

LEARNING OUTCOMES-The child will be able to: -

Dear Facilitators,

It may be suggested that the co-facilitators arrange following materials beforehand.

MATERIAL REQUIRED

- 1) Any one seasonal flower.
- 2)One light shade poster colour.
- 3)Paint brush and one small bowl of water.
- 4)One A-4 size white sheet (with lower-case letters written on it)

ACTIVITY

Facilitator may conduct Stamping Game activity during Virtual Circle Time. The facilitator may keep the cut-outs of uppercase letters with her in a bag before conducting the game. Children may keep the sheet with the previously covered lowercase letters written in front of them. The facilitator may pull out one uppercase letter from the bag and pronounce the letter loudly. Children would find out its matching lowercase letter and stamp it with a flower impression.

WRITING READINESS ACTIVITIES AND EXPERIENCES

LEAF TRACING

LEARNING OUTCOMES: The child will be able to:

- 1. enjoy the leaf tracing activity.
- 2. improve fine motor coordination.
- 3. develop creative expression.

Leaf tracing helps in improving children's fine motor skills and also, they will get to know about different levels of pressure they have to apply to get desired leaf impression.

The facilitator will guide the children to place a white sheet of paper over the leaf. They will be asked to take the impression of the leaf with the help of a crayon. Children will observe their leaves magically appearing on the paper.

TIP: The co-facilitator may guide the children to choose leaves with veins clearly visible.

LET'S MAKE OUR OWN BRUSHES

LEARNING OUTCOMES: The child will be able to:

- 1. enjoy making brushes.
- 2. develop creative expression.

MATERIAL REQUIRED:

- 1. Few twigs and different types of leaves.
- 2. White sheet
- Rubber Bands
- 4. Poster Colours

STEPS:

- 1. Secure a leaf to a twig with the help of a rubber band.
- 2. Make four to five similar brushes using different types of leaves.
- 3. Dip these brushes into poster colour and see what textures, lines and patterns they make/ print on paper.

CORRELATION OF NUMBERS


LEARNING OUTCOMES-The child will be able to-

STEPS

- 1- The Facilitator will arrange four basic shapes for students.
- 2- Children will make hands and legs of shape buddies by folding white as shown in the images.
- 3- Paste googly eyes and shapes buddies in sketch book.

Revision of shapes may also be done by arranging cut outs of circles, squares, rectangles, triangles and oval to create a scene.




ODD ONE OUT

MATERIAL REQUIRED:

- 1. One A3 sized white sheet
- 2. Four leaves of different sizes
- 3. Green poster colour
- 4. Paint brush
- 5. One small bowl of water
- 6. A paper plate

STEPS:

- 1. Take a paper plate and pour some green poster colour on it.
- 2. Apply green colour on back of the leaves using a paint brush.
- 3. Now print the impression of leaves on white sheet in a seriation order from the smallest to the biggest.

SPRING YOGA


BREATHE-CALM-CONNECT WITH NATURE

CREATIVE EXPRESSION AND EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

The main focus of NEP 2020 is on creativity and critical thinking to encourage logical decision making and innovation. An art integrated learning makes the entire teaching learning process fun filled and joyful.

Children can develop skills much faster when they enjoy or when they are having fun. The hands-on learning and experiences are much more effective than simply being told about them, as rightly said in the proverb.

AIR EXPERIMENT

AIR CAN MOVE OBJECTS

This experiment will help children to discover and observe the power of air to move objects. The facilitator may take this experiment during virtual circle time.

LEARNING OUTCOMES- The child will be able to:

- 1. develop critical thinking skills.
- 2. enhance his/her reasoning skills.
- 3. discover the property of air.

MATERIAL REQUIRED -

- 1. straw
- 2. petals

STEPS TO BE FOLLOWED-

The facilitator will ask the children to blow the straw near the petals and observe its movement. She will further tell that air is invisible. It has no shape, smell or colour. We can only feel the air.

FANCY DRESS

(PLANTS/FLOWERS/FRUITS/VEGETABLES)

Fancy dress can be super fun and an enjoyable experience for our young learners. It encourages creative thinking and develops self-confidence.

LEARNING OUTCOMES--The child will be able to-

- 1) develop listening and speaking skills.
- 2) gain confidence.
- 3) enhance his/her creativity.

ACTIVITY- FANCY DRESS




Fancy dress can be organised for our tiny tots on the Theme- "PLANTS". They can dress up and resemble their favourite plant/flower/vegetable or fruit, during virtual circle time. It will be appreciated if the children wear self-created attire. It will be a very enriching and enjoyable experience for our young learners and will boost their self-confidence.

COLLAGE MAKING

LEARNING OUTCOMES--The child will be able to-

- 4. understand and enjoy the use of multiple resources in making a collage.



The facilitator will discuss about various things plants need to grow with the children and encourage them to make a collage on growing a plant using paper cut-outs and different items during virtual circle time.

MATERIAL REQUIRED -

- wrapping paper/ magazine paper cut out of three flowers.
- Three buttons.
- Two green colour popsicle sticks/straw.
- Blue colour play dough.
- Cut-outs of leaves and sun.
- Image of a girl/boy holding a watering can.
- Bits of brown paper.
- One A-4 size blue pastel sheet.
- Brown crayon.
- Fevistick.





STEPS TO MAKE A COLLAGE-

- 1. On an A-4 Size sheet, mark the section for the soil and paste bits of brown paper.
- Paste cut-out of the sun on the top left side and cut-out of a girl holding a watering can.
- Paste a button on the centre of each flower.
- 4. On green colour popsicle stick, paste cut-out of flowers and leaves.
- 5. Make small water droplets flowing from the watering can with blue playdough.
- 6. "Growing A Plant" collage is ready.









BRIDGING ACTIVITIES

Dear Facilitators,

Bridging activities provide a window into a child's developmental progress on a continuum of learning that spans not just weeks or months but several years. It consists of different hands-on learning base activities which helps the child to observe, explore and learn various concepts, which is an important part for their all-round development.

ACTIVITY - FEED THE BUNNY LETTER GAME

LEARNING OUTCOMES: The child will be able to –

- 1) enjoy learning the sounds of letters.
- 2) associate the sound with the correct letter.

Letter games are extended learning activities and make learning letters and their sounds joyful. Feed the Bunny is a perfect way for young learners to practice letters during spring time.

MATERIAL REQUIRED: -

Bunny box

- 1) A bunny box may be prepared, using any big sized empty bowl /box.
- 2) Box may be filled with paper shredding/pom- poms/coloured pasta/soil/grass.

Bunny Puppet: -

1) One small box /container covered with white paper.

- 2)Cut-out of a bunny face
- 3) fevicol

(Puppet may be kept in the box)

<u> Carrots/ Seasonal vegetable: -</u>

- 1. Five –Six cut-outs' carrots/any seasonal vegetables may be used.
- 2. The carrots may be planted in the bunny box.
- 3. On each carrot write one letter.
- 4. Pegs/Tongs



Facilitator may encourage children to play this game at least once a week to recapitulate the letters during the virtual circle time.

TO PLAY:

- 1) Facilitator will pronounce a sound of any one letter.
- 2) Children will identify the letter, listening to the sound.
- 3) They will pull the carrot out with the help of tong/peg.
- 4) And feed the bunny.

MATERIAL REQUIRED

Old newspaper and a bucket.

STEPS

3- Place the bucket 4 feet away from the throw point, so that your child can

target the ball in the bucket.
