Bharat and Bharati are having a conversation (Video call) with their cousin brother Sameer who lives in London. He wants to know about the festivals, traditions, and culture of India.

Bharat: Hello, Sameer! How are you?

Sameer: Hello Bharat and Bharati! I am good. Hope you are doing well too.

REPUBLIC DAY



Republic Day is celebrated as the constitution of the country came into effect on January 26, 1950. Republic day celebrations are spread across three days, beginning with the Prime Minister of India paying tribute to the soldiers who sacrificed their lives for the nation, at Amar Jawan Jyoti, India Gate. The President then hoists the Tricolour at the Red Fort to the accompaniment of the National Anthem. Then the ceremonies begin with a 21-gun salute. The celebrations conclude with the Beating Retreat ceremony by the armed forces (Army, Air Force, Navy) on 29 January at Raisina Hill.

Prior to the Republic Day, we find many people selling the National Flag at traffic lights, in the market areas and at many other places. We must respect our National Flag by taking care of the following points-

- Do not use the National Flag as a toy and throw on roads or dustbins.
- Hoist the flag at a height in a suitable manner.
- Saffron band should be the topmost.
- Do not let the flag fall/touch the ground.

P.S. For the activities Unity Doll and Tricolour Bookmark, the facilitators may frame simple steps to conduct the activities as per their interest and creativity.

ACTIVITY TIME

UNITY DOLL

Hands-on activity to try to teach "Unity is Strength" and how we all are united despite being of different cultures.

Material Required: Orange, White, Green colour Origami paper, Glue, Crayons.

SALAD MAKING

The facilitator will take up the concept of Tricolour through the salad making activity. Then she will explain about the importance of including raw fruits and vegetables in our daily diet.

Facilitator will tell the students, that fruits and vegetables are known as Protective Foods and eating seasonal fruits and veggies protect us from diseases and keep us fit and healthy.

The facilitator will take up the activity Salad making during the virtual circle time.

Ingredients:

- *Papaya/Oranges diced into small pieces
- *Banana/Radish/peeled apple diced into small pieces
- *Kiwi/Cucumber/steamed peas/Broccoli diced into small piece
- *Lemon juice
- *Salt and Pepper
- *Chat Masala
- *A rectangular tray





Facilitator will ask the students to arrange the pieces of fruits and vegetables on the tray following the sequence of colours in an Indian Tricolour flag. Students will add a dash of lemon juice and sprinkle some salt and pepper to enhance the flavour.

And the healthy Tricolour Fruit and Vegetable salad is ready.

PEOPLE WHO HELP US

Dear Facilitator,

A community helper is a person who helps keep our community functioning well. This would include firefighters, mail carriers, dentists, doctors, construction workers, and mechanics. It's important for children to know the people in the community who provide a supporting role. Children should feel that they are able to approach a member of the fire brigade or police services, without being scared, and understand how seriously they will be taken when they are relaying information and they are to be used in emergency situations.

Interaction with People Who help us:

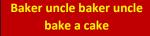

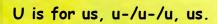

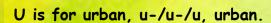

Uncle: That will be great Bharat!









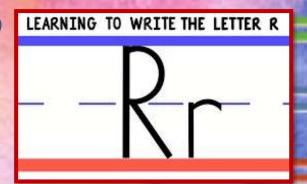

VOCABULARY WORDS

Facilitators will encourage little learners to look around for our helpers. The names and work areas of our helpers will be explained with the help of PPT.

SIGHT WORD - Her, His, You

It's essential to teach students to memorize sight words as a whole so that they can recognize them instantly. These words can be learnt effortlessly by providing a print-rich environment to the learners. Once students master sight words, they are able to understand at least half of the words in any particular text. Moreover, teaching sight words not only helps students read more fluently, it helps them write more efficiently too.

The facilitator will explain the meaning of the words - her, his and you.

Then she will frame a sentence for each sight word as an example. She may then ask the learners to frame a few sentences using the above sight words.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

The child will be able to:

- develop listening skills.
- identify the sight words "her", "his" and "you" and understand their usage.

BLOCKS AND NUMBERS

CORRELATION OF NUMBERS 1-10

Learning to compare quantities helps Preschoolers begin to make sense of relationships between numbers. It helps build children's language and social skills as well as a general understanding of their immediate environment. It is so important to develop this early confidence so that they don't "fear" Math like many adults do.

QUIZ

The facilitator will play a quiz wherein the child is required to count the number of tools for each helper given and identify the correct answer.

Learning Outcomes:

The child will be able to-

- count the objects and identify the correct number.
- recognize numbers from 1-10
- develop an understanding of the number concept

PUZZLES

We love to play with puzzles. We like the way they challenge our thinking and exercise our minds. Puzzles are also an important educational learning tool for toddlers and young children as they provide many skills and mental learning benefits and opportunities. Puzzles help children practice social skills and language skills. So, let's have fun by matching numbers to the correct quantity.

Activity1: Facilitator will have discussion on helpers and their tools with the children and then play the following puzzle with them.

Children have to count and map the number of objects(tools) to the correct number by dragging the correct number of tools (from the right side) in front of the number and helper (on the left side).

Learning Outcomes:

The child will be able to:

- count numbers from 1 to 10 in a sequence.
- understand that a certain quantity has its corresponding number symbol.
- associate the corresponding quantity with the number.
- Identify the tools used by different helpers.

Activity 2: Help the gardener to number the flowers in serial order from numbers 1-10 by dragging the number to the center of the flower.

Learning Outcomes:

The child will be able to:

- Enhance observation skills
- Build his/her visual discrimination and thinking skills.
- Count numbers serially from 1-10

COMPARISON

Preschoolers who are just learning to compare larger quantities begin by matching the objects one-by-one to see which group has more or less number of objects. Then, as children gain more experience with comparing, they learn to compare quantities.

 Exposure to early number concepts makes them more creative and allows them to solve critical problems by analyzing them.

Heavy and Light

Facilitator will first ask the children to bring several types of things, some that are light and others that are heavy, like cotton and a ball. The facilitator will ask the children to hold both the things in separate hands and help them notice how a ball is heavy than cotton. Children may be asked to repeat with different things available at home like different fruits and vegetables or their toys.

MAKING OF A BALANCING SCALE

Making of a balancing scale to make them understand the comparison between heavy and light. Pre-Schoolers always love to weigh every item. They play "Which one is heavier?" game and we can now help them make a balance scale at home

Material required for the activity:

- · 1 big disposable glass
- · 2 small disposable glasses
- · 1 scale/ruler
- · Cello tape
- · Sketch pen
- · Thread
- · 1 eraser
- · 1 lemon
- 1 pencil
- 1 onion
- · 1 origami sheet



HEAVY

The learners will make their balancing/weighing scales under the guidance of the facilitators. The facilitators and the learners may refer to the hints given below to make their own balancing scale.

- Step 1: Keep the big disposable glass upside down and paste a sketch pen on its top (bottom) with the help of cello tape.
- Step 2: Make two holes on the opposite sides on both the small glasses to tie the thread across.
- Step 3. Balance a scale on the top of the big glass and hang the two small glasses with their threads on the scale.
 - Now your Balancing scale is ready. Start comparing the weights of the objects.

Learning Outcomes:

The child will be able to-

- Compare two objects.
- Learn about the concept of heavy and light.
- * Differentiate between heavy and light objects in his/her immediate environment.

OVAL SHAPE

Dear facilitators,

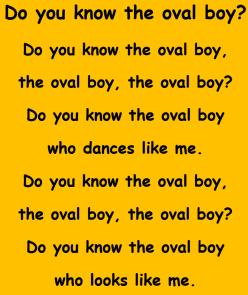

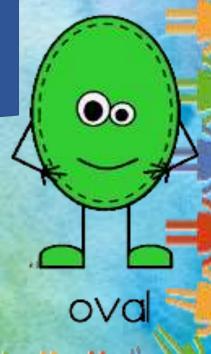

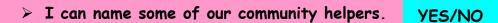
