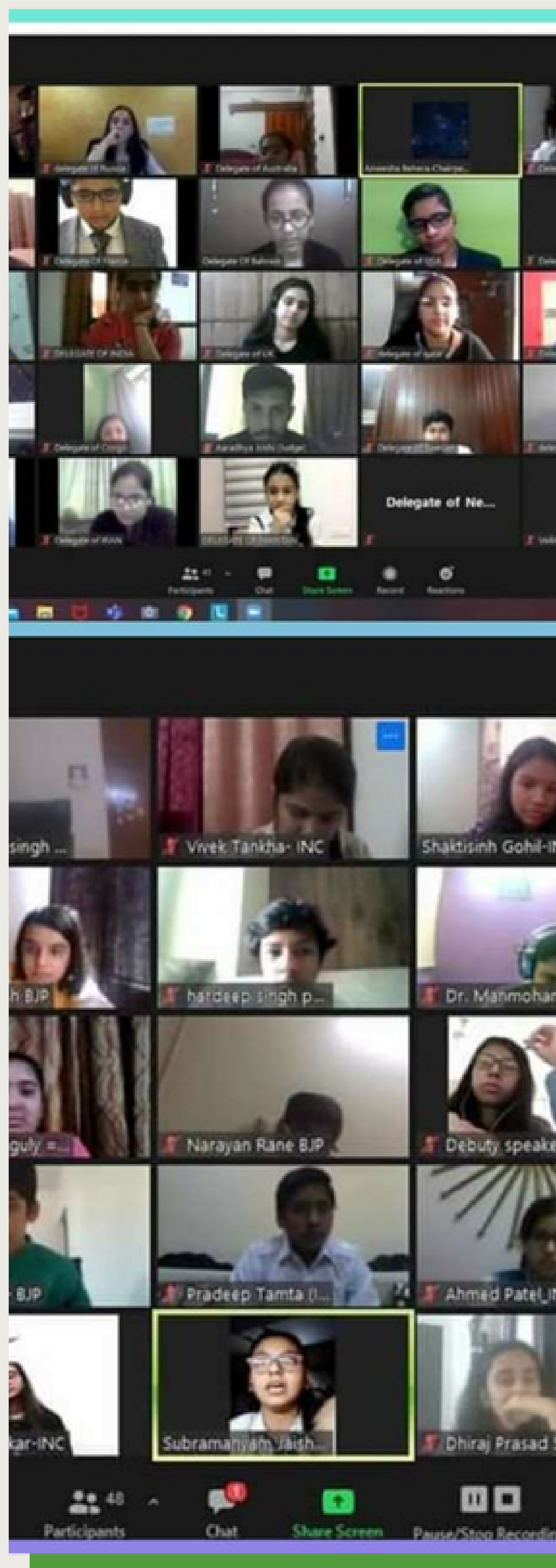
FROM THE SECRETARIAT'S DESK

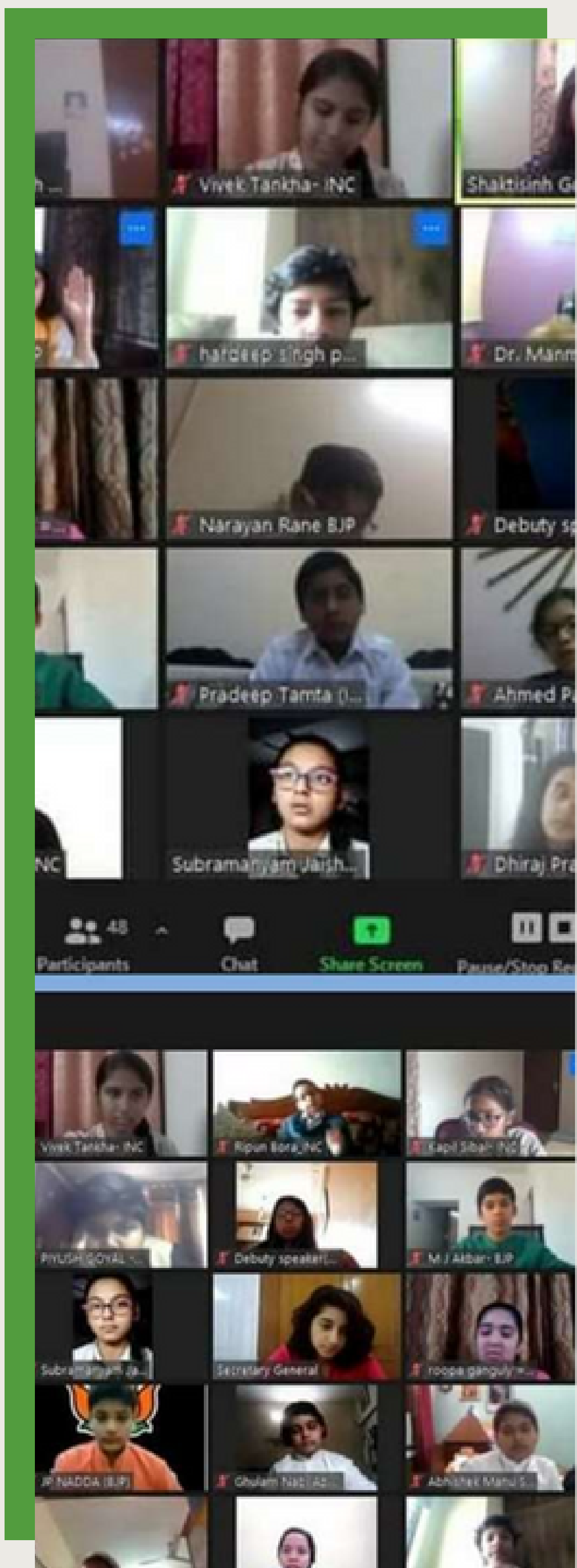
We congratulate all the participants on being and well-informed and enthusiastic delegates and parliamentarians.

OVERVIEW



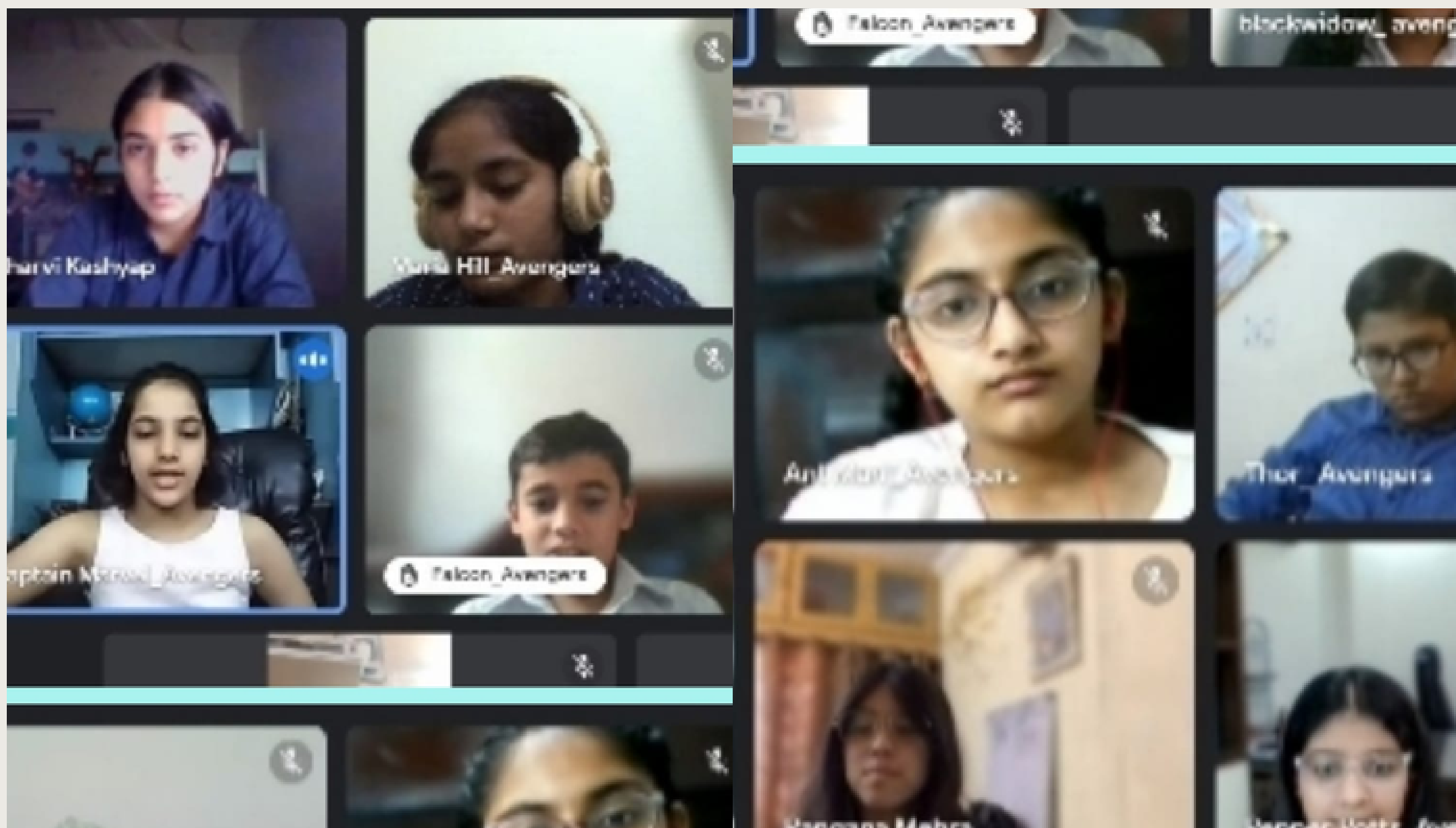

AVENGERS

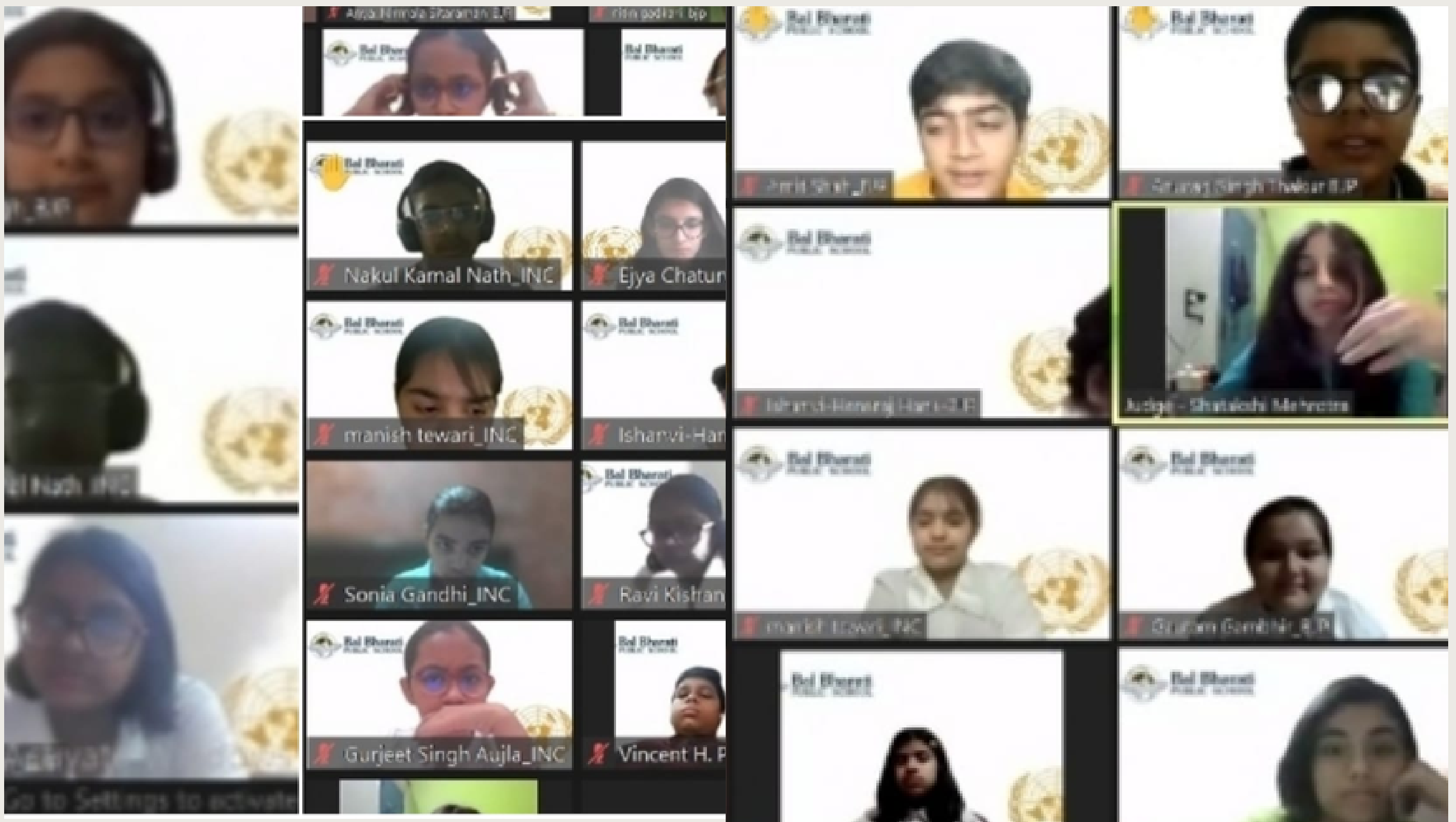

UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL

The delegate of Pakistan vehemently argued that Kashmir belongs to Pakistan and blamed India for never having recognised the muslim majority in the area and highlighted Pakistan's claim over Junagarh. This was opposed by the delegates of India and Belgium who asserted that Raja Harish Chandra had acceded Kashmir to India and therefore Pakistan could not claim its authority over the territory. The delegate of Russia claimed that adoption of negotiations and peaceful resolution of these issues must be the priority for both the countries.

MODERATED CAUCUS started with the Topic- 'State Sponsored Terrorism in the Disputed Region' for the duration of 15 minutes. The delegate of India talked about Pakistan being home to terrorism, while the Pakistani delegate claimed that India terrorism to hide its mistakes and atrocities on the land.
