We are deeply pained and aggrieved to see the news of a young child being electrocuted after he touched the wet gate of his residential society. To prevent such mishaps, we must sensitize our children about the perils of touching wet surfaces/touching objects with wet hand and make them aware about the importance of wearing shoes or slippers when handling electrical appliances.

Please reinforce the following safety measures with your children:

- Avoiding Muddy Puddles and Waterlogged Areas: Discourage them from playing in these areas to prevent accidents, such as falling into potholes.
- Electrical Safety: Educate them about the dangers of touching electrical wires, poles, and appliances during rainy weather to mitigate the risk of electrocution. Objects labelled as hazardous should not be touched by students. Students should not venture near electric meters or switchboards.
- Hygiene Practices: Stress the importance of frequent handwashing, particularly before eating and after outdoor activities, to prevent the spread of germs.
- Mosquito Protection: Ensure they wear full sleeve clothing to minimize mosquito bites and reduce the risk of diseases like malaria and dengue.

Our school is taking every possible step and implementing highest safety standards to provide a secure environment for children. Teachers are diligently reinforcing these safety protocols and emphasizing the importance of being cautious around electrical gadgets and hazardous areas. We ask for your support in reinforcing these precautions at home.
