Child Education Society®, the apex body of Bal Bharati Public Schools and other institutions of higher education, was registered in 1944 under the Registration of Societies Act, 1860. Our founders had the vision of preserving and fostering Indian culture, heritage, tradition and ethos, and for this, they considered it essential to impart value-based education to young people.

Today, the affairs of the Society are managed by a Board of Management consisting of reputed educationists and social workers, with Shri Nikhil Channa, an eminent educationist and entrepreneur, as the President of the Society. Each school is governed by a separate Managing Committee, in accordance with the rules prescribed by the state where it is located, but is ultimately responsible to the Board of Management.

Bal Bharati Public Schools are co-educational English medium schools affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE). Hindi enjoys a place of pride as the national language in our curriculum. 

Pre-school and Pre-primary

The school follows the Montessori method of teaching at this stage. The pupils learn in an informal way with the help of specially designed apparatus under the supervision and guidance of trained and experienced teachers. Special attention is paid to facilitate the physical, mental, emotional and social growth of the child through a series of well-coordinated activities. Curriculum-based activities provide conducive learning ground to children and enhance their confidence. Beautiful and artistically painted theme-based classrooms provide a stimulating and friendly learning environment to the students. Smart boards/ Interactive panels make learning joyful for curious little minds. Apart from this, a sensorial garden provides children a holistic experience - visual, olfactory, tactile and auditory.

Primary

In the Primary Department, emphasis is given not only on acquisition of new knowledge but also on concept formation and application of knowledge in practical life situations. Stress is laid on 'learning by doing'. Children are given personal attention. They are exposed to pictorial informative books and audio-visual programmes which excite their interest in learning. Students are not unduly burdened with home assignments and are evaluated through their performance in various curricular and co-curricular activities.

Middle, Secondary and Senior Secondary

To ignite students' interest in learning, latest teaching-learning methodologies are followed. Selfdiscipline of the body and mind is practised through conscious and deliberate efforts. Performance of pupils is graded as per CBSE recommendations.

Infrastructure



Laboratories

The school aims at developing the spirit of enquiry and a scientific temper in students from an early stage. In addition to customised computer-aided learning, projects, models, charts, PowerPoint presentations and other scientific educational aids, students learn through experiments and demonstrations in modern and well-equipped Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Computer, Geography and Mathematics laboratories.

Technologically-enabled classrooms

The school provides computer-aided learning management systems from Montessori to class XII. Pedagogically sound and visually rich curriculum resources are hereby mapped and customised to the needs of the students. AV aids provide tools and content for interactive self-paced learning for students, and interactive panels provide rich media presentations for teacher-led classroom learning.

Health centre

The health centre is managed by qualified medical professionals. The centre is equipped with facilities to deal with day-to-day health problems of students. Regular medical check-ups are organised to ensure well-being of the students. A tie-up with reputed health agencies and hospitals provides services such as health insurance, 24x7 ambulance, medical care on campus, and telephonic consultation with medical experts to students and staff.

School library

The school has well-stocked libraries with a good collection of books ranging from encyclopaedias to fiction and text books. The libraries are enriched with a collection of digital tools and resources used by the students for reference work. 'Book Week' encourages learning beyond text books. Thoughtfully graded books are made accessible to students in Senior and Junior libraries. Laptops and Kindle readers are available for use in Wi-Fi enabled zone in the school library.

International dimension

The school has ventured into collaborative international projects with UK, Australia, China, Japan, New Zealand, Malta, USA etc. The principal, staff members and students have been on mutual visits to chalk out new education programmes and strategies which are then effectively disseminated. This provides wonderful opportunities to the students to experience and collect first-hand information about social, political, geographical and cultural milieu of other parts of the globe through experiential learning.

Admission criteria

Age criteria: Children born between 01.04.2021 and 31.03.2022 will be eligible for admission to Pre-school. Total number of seats: 240

- Except for EWS/ DG, Staff wards and Management quota seats, for the rest of the seats, 50% seats will be given to boys and 50% to girls.
- The remaining seats of category B (if any) will become open seats.

Admission Schedule & Criteria

General instructions for Pre-school admission

- Age criteria: Children born between 01.04.2021 and 31.03.2022 will be eligible for admission to Pre-school.
- Please visit the school website before filling up the form to get detailed information about the school.
- An incomplete or incorrect application will be rejected.
- No Prospectus to be sold. Only Registration Fee of Rs. 25/- will be charged and payment mode is online only.
- Please retain the transaction ID and copy of the form received.
- Only one registration per child is allowed. Multiple applications will lead to the cancellation of registration.
- <u>Only the printout submitted in the drop box at school gate no.1 will be considered for admission</u>. Please drop the printout of the final successful registration form along with the Google Map displaying the aerial distance from the school as proof of distance.
- Google Map will be used to calculate the aerial distance from school gate no.1 to your residence. Any discrepancy in the distance will lead to cancellation of the form.
- Recheck all the details carefully before clicking on the submit button as no corrections will be allowed after submission.
- Admission will be granted subject to verification of documents. A list of the provisionally shortlisted candidates along with the first waiting list will be put up on the school notice board and website on January 17, 2025 at 05:00 pm.
- If the address/ DOB or any other detail supplied by the parent is found to be incorrect, registration will be cancelled with immediate effect.
- There will be no interaction with the parent/ child.
- There will be no weightage for parents' educational qualifications, occupation or financial status.

Valid residential proof

- 1) Ration Card/ Smart Card issued in the name of parents (mother/ father) having the name of the child.
- 2) Domicile certificate of child or his/her parents.
- 3) Voter I-Card (EPIC) of any of the parents.
- 4) Electricity Bill/ MTNL Telephone bill/ Water bill/ Passport in the name of any of the parents or child.
- 5) Aadhaar Card/ Unique Identity Card in the name of mother/ father/ child issued by Govt of India.
- 6) Rent Deed will not be deemed as valid proof for residence.

PLEASE NOTE:

- 1) With reference to Directorate of Education Circular No. F.DE.15(172)/PSB/2016/6455-6464 dated 11/11/2024, all applicants falling under the criteria of age relaxation bracket up to 30 days for the minimum and upper age limit are requested to contact the Admission Incharge physically with an application between 9:00 am to 1:00 pm on all working days.
- 2) <u>Date of Birth certificate</u> of the child: It must have the name of the child and of the parents, as submitted in the registration form.
- 3) Please retain the copy of the receipt through the mail, for further correspondence.
- 4) At the time of admission/ verification of documents:
 - a. The Aadhaar Card/ UID card of parents and the child should have the same address.
 - b. The Voter I-Card of both the parents must contain the same address.

For admission to EWS and Disadvantaged categories

For admission to EWS/ Disadvantaged/ Children with Special Needs, rules framed by DOE will be followed.



The fixation of the revised fee structure is under consideration and will be notified as soon as it is finalised.

Mode of payment of school fee

Collection of fees would be done through online payment portal. However, the first fee at the time of admission is to be paid only through a Demand Draft.
