

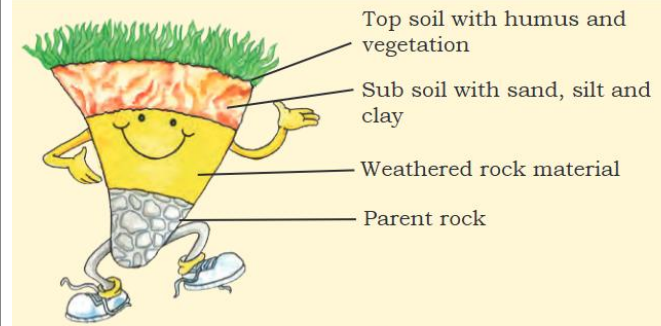


Fig. 2.3: Soil Profile

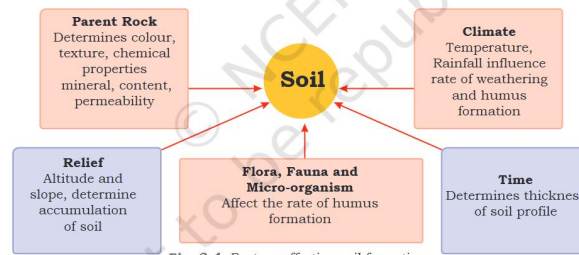


Fig. 2.4: Factors affecting soil formation

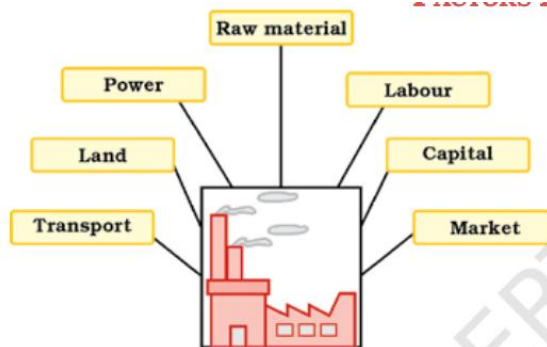


Fig 5.3: Locational factors for industries
