Delegates called for increased UN aid, safe humanitarian access, and protection of refugees in neighboring countries. Proposals ranged from regional cooperation and targeted sanctions to the creation of a UN monitoring mission. While no resolution was passed, the session reflected strong global concern and a shared commitment to justice and stability in Afghanistan.

The United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (UNCSW) held a one-day session exploring the intersection of gender equality, cultural traditions, and religious practices. Delegates discussed how cultural norms affect women's rights in areas like bodily autonomy, dress codes, and access to education and healthcare.

While some stressed the importance of cultural sovereignty, others advocated for stronger global protections against discriminatory practices disguised as tradition. Proposals included inclusive policymaking, local empowerment, and promoting dialogue between cultural values and human rights.

Though no resolution was passed, the session underscored a shared global commitment to ensuring that culture never compromises women's dignity and freedom.

Discussions highlighted divergent views on accountability, sanctions, and the role of diplomatic engagement. Delegations underscored the urgent need for innovative peace strategies to de-escalate tensions and protect civilians caught in the crossfire.

While consensus remained elusive, the session demonstrated a unified commitment to exploring practical solutions aimed at restoring peace and ensuring lasting security.

The debate brought forward concerns about federalism, regional diversity, and the logistical challenges of synchronizing state and national polls. While some supported the idea as a means to strengthen democratic participation and governance, others cautioned against undermining local autonomy. Though no final consensus was reached, the session underscored the collective interest in electoral reforms that promote efficient and inclusive democracy.

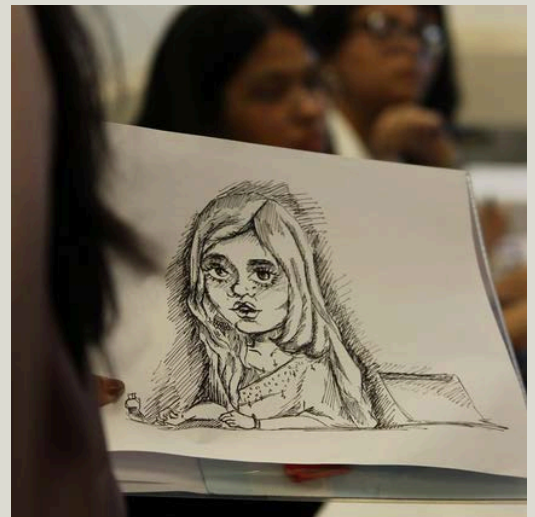

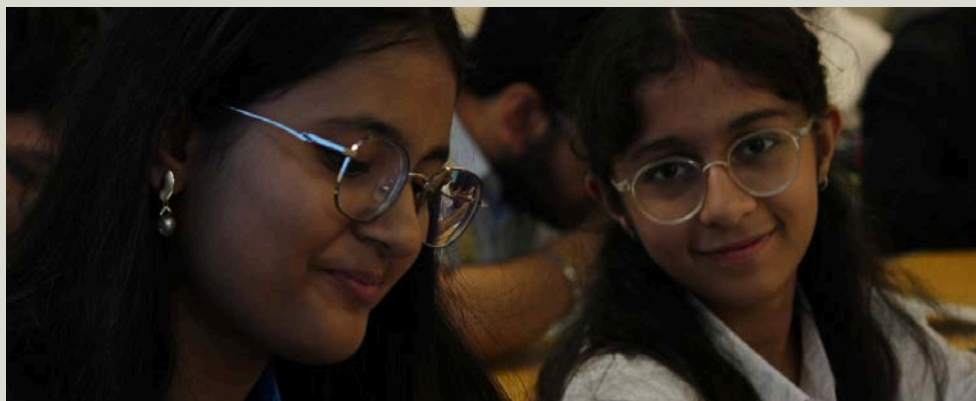
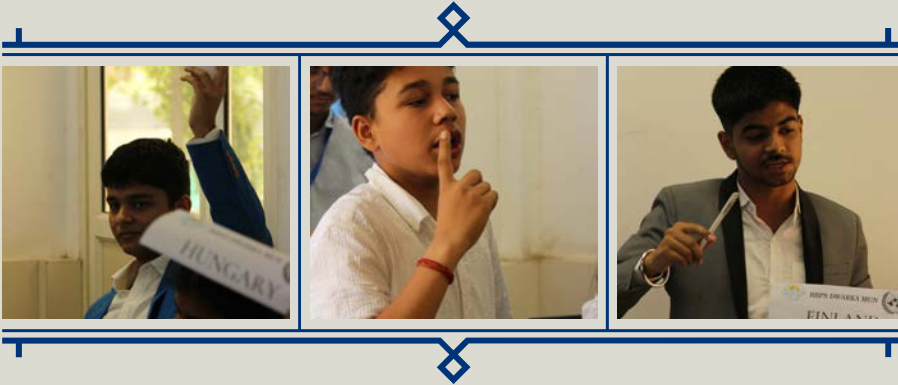
